Standalone Health Information Service Provider (HISP) or HISP provided by a third party	61%	49%	na
State, regional, or local HIO	59%	46%	46%
Single EHR vendor network	43%	41%	34%
Multi-EHR vendor network	35%	32%	32%

ONC relies on surveys to measure how national networks and HIOs are enabling exchange and interoperability

- We know the types of providers that are engaged in exchange, what methods they are using to enable exchange and to a certain extent the barriers providers face
- However, there are limitations to this approach.
 - Self-reported and subject to (mis)interpretation
 - Difficult to measure certain topics via survey (e.g., volume, usage, impacts)
 - Burden
- As the Trusted Exchange Framework moves forward, it will be important to better understand the usage of various networks to enable exchange and interoperability beyond surveys
